The IB Middle Years Program (MYP) is designed as an inclusive, whole-school program by the International Baccalaureate (IB), a not-for-profit organization supporting the education of more than 1 million students every year in over 4,000 schools in 147 countries.

At the core of all IB programs is the learner profile, 10 attributes fostered in students that promote their development as responsible members of their local, national, and global communities. IB learners strive to be inquirers, knowledgeable, thinkers, communicators, principled, open-minded, caring, courageous, balanced and reflective. These characteristics are infused in the daily educational experience in the CSMS Middle Years Program.



The MYP curriculum: The MYP curriculum consists of eight subject groups:
