It will be your responsibility to deliver the flyer/material, bundled in appropriate quantities (see below for distribution instructions), with a copy of this signed approved application to each school.

- 1. Review Board Policy 1325 (see pg. 2) to see if your flyer(s)/material(s) fall within the policy guidelines
 - o ie "All informational materials...shall contain a disclaimer that it is not a program of the Buckeye Union School District."
- 2. Complete this Application to Distribute Flyers/Materials

Public Information Materials

To cooperate in publicizing community services, special events and public meetings of interest to students and parents/guardians, and to allow for the raising of funds which directly benefit District schools consistent with curricular and extracurricular objectives established by the District, the Superintendent or designee may approve the distribution of printed materials prepared by service organizations, or nonprofit groups within the boundaries of Buckeye Union School District which extend the community's cultural, recreational, artistic or educational opportunities.

Materials prepared by governmental agencies may be approved by the school site principal.

Materials to be distributed shall not include any which:

- 1. Are obscene, libelous, or slanderous, or which incite students to commit unlawful acts, violate school rules, or disrupt the school's orderly operation. (Education Code 48907)
- 2. Attack or denigrate any group on account of sexual orientation, sexual preference, gender, race, color, national origin, ancestry, religion, sex, age, ethnicity, gender, socio-economic status, or mental or physical disability or sexual harassment.

All informational materials to be distributed shall bear the name, contact location, and telephone number of the sponsoring group, and shall contain a **disclaimer that it is not a program of the Buckeye Union School District**.

Approved materials may be disseminated:

- 1. by students on a voluntary basis
- 2. from a central location announced in the Newsletter
- 3. electronically via the website

All surveys or questionnaires requiring student or parent/guardian response must be first approved by the Assistant Superintendent or designee.

Advertising

Solicitation of students for commercial purposes on school premises is prohibited unless specifically approved by the Superintendent or designee.

Advertising of commercial products or services will not be distributed in district schools.

District schools shall not distribute unsolicited merchandise for which an ensuing payment is requested.

School-sponsored or district-sponsored publications, announcements, radio and television programs may accept paid advertising and promotional material except that which:

- 1. Is obscene, libelous, or slanderous, or which incites students to commit unlawful acts, violate school rules, or disrupt the school's orderly operation.
- 2. Attacks or denigrates any group on account of sexual orientation, gender, ethnic group identification, race, color, ancestry, religion, socio-economic status, or mental or physical disability.
- 3. Promotes the use or sale of materials or services which are illegal or inconsistent with school objectives. Ads for tobacco, intoxicants, and x-rated movies or products shall not be used.
- 4. Violates district contracts or federal broadcast licenses.
