PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Hello Bengals,

Wow! Spring has sprung! As much as I love the weather, the colors, and the chirping birds, I'm not looking forward to the allergies and the behaviors! Spring tends to be a busy time of year in middle school, and I'm sure this year will not be an exception!

A few important points I'd like to highlight in this month's bulletin. The first is information about exploratory options for the 2020-2021 school year. Be sure students understand deadlines and know how to complete the necessary application for the class they want. Any student not completing an application will automatically be placed in the exploratory wheel of art, digital media, and life skills (one trimester of each class). Please note that some classes have space limitations, so not every student will be accepted into their first choice for a class.

The second topic of conversation is the fabulous state testing time! Because we realize the intensity of the test, we are trying the schedule a bit differently this year. The language arts performance test (SBA) will be the first assessment given, and they will be done PRIOR to spring break March 23-27 during their LA class. We will be on a block schedule all week except for Wednesday, March 25, and we will be testing every day of that week. PLEASE plan in advance to schedule appointments outside of this testing window. The rest of the assessments will be given AFTER spring break to allow for a bit of a breather after the language arts writing portion, which can be extremely taxing. We start back up on Wednesday, April 22, and testing runs every day through May 12. The block schedule days for this second half of testing are May 4, 5, 7, and 8. Please, if you absolutely MUST schedule an appointment on any of these dates, please check with your child about the block schedule to avoid interfering with testing. We thank you in advance for scheduling your appointments outside of the testing window!

Speaking of doctor's appointments, what a flu season! Add to that concerns about Coronavirus, and we're in full disinfecting mode. Though we are very concerned about improving our attendance, we do not want students who are sick with fever or vomiting to come to school. Please take care of your children and have them stay home if they've had a fever in the past 24 hours.

We do have some important information about 8th grade promotion activities in this bulletin, so be sure to read that carefully. ALL PARENTS should note that Friday, May 29 is a late start day for RHMS only to accommodate our 8th graders' promotion ceremony that takes place at 7:45 am. Sixth and seventh graders start school that day at 9:50 and buses will run their regular routes, just two hours later. Just want you to have advance notice to plan accordingly.

And speaking of planning accordingly, PARENTS OF CURRENT 6th GRADERS: your child must submit proof of Tdap vaccination in order to receive a schedule on Bengal Day and start classes on the first day of school.

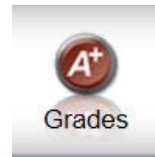

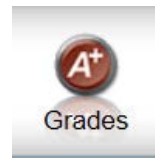

SPANISH 1A – ATTENTION CURRENT 6TH GRADE STUDENTS: ONLY THOSE STUDENTS WHO QUALIFY ACCORDING TO PREREQUISITES BELOW WILL BE GIVEN AN APPLICATION FORM IN THEIR LANGUAGE ARTS CLASSES.

Prerequisites are:

- Must have a grade of “B+” or above in Language Arts for all 3 trimesters of 6th grade
- Good attendance record
- Must be earning a “C” or better in all classes

Applications will be distributed on Monday, March 23 in your student’s Language Arts class if your child meets the above criteria. If your student wants to sign up to take Spanish, the application is due back to Mrs. Peterson in the office. Please note space is limited and applications are taken on a first come, first-served basis and are date stamped. A waiting list will be started only for students with and 85% or higher in Language Arts for all 3 trimesters.

Taking Spanish in middle school requires a two-year commitment. Spanish IA is a year-long course that covers the equivalent of the first semester of high school Spanish. Spanish IB, which is taken in the 8th grade, is equal to the 2nd semester of High School Spanish. In other words, by taking Spanish IA in the 7th grade and Spanish IB in the 8th grade, students will have completed the first year of high school Spanish. Please note that because this is a High School class, students should expect approximately 15 to 20 minutes of homework nightly. Though entry into Spanish II as a 9th grader is not guaranteed, it is highly probable for students who are successful in Spanish 1A/1B. Please note that though they are allowed into Spanish II as a 9th grader, they do NOT receive high school credit for Spanish 1.

TEACHER AIDES – ATTENTION CURRENT 7TH GRADE STUDENTS: A student wanting to aide for a teacher must have good attendance, good grades (no Ds or Fs), be a good citizen and be able to take directions and work independently. Teachers will either ask students themselves, or ask the office to give them a list of students who are interested in aiding. If a teacher asks a student to be his/her aide, the office will send a note to the student to verify if he/she wants to aide for the teacher. If you want to aide and have not been asked by a teacher, you can sign up in the office from March 23-April 3. Students will be sent a note if they are assigned to a teacher.

OFFICE AIDES – ATTENTION CURRENT 7TH GRADE STUDENTS: Office aides represent our school and a good aide with a great attitude is an essential piece in helping our school run efficiently. To apply, you will need to write a short essay stating why you want to be an aide and tell us about your personality. Applicants will have a short interview with Mrs. Lee on Wednesday, April 29.

PROMOTION INFORMATION

On Friday, May 29 we will be hosting our 8th Grade Promotion Ceremony at 7:45 am at the Rolling Hills Middle School blacktop.

There will be a late start to school this day for 6th and 7th grade students as we need all teachers to help us with the promotion ceremony. As a result, school will start at 9:50 and end at 2:04 pm. Students in elementary school have a full, regular day of classes on Friday.

General Information:

- Graduates need to report to the RHMS blacktop by 7:30 am.
- The promotion ceremony will last approximately 1 hour.
- Because ORHS is still in session, parking will be a major challenge. Get here early and plan to walk far.
- Please note that we do not allow you to reserve seats. If you arrive early and stay until the ceremony, you may reserve the seats you need. However, any kind of “cordoning off” of seats with ribbon, towels, etc. will be removed.
- There is no formal photographer. Please be respectful of others when taking pictures of your child.
- Seating is only available on the lower blacktop.
- Handicap parking is available in the parking lot closest to the gym.
- There is no shade, so please wear sunscreen, bring a hat, or umbrella. If you bring an umbrella, please be courteous of other patrons who sit behind you if it is needed during the ceremony. There is also no heat and the last few years it has been COLD! Only guarantee on weather – it’ll be either really hot or really cold!
- If you have a child being promoted, please schedule a place to meet after the ceremony.
- ***Siblings of those being promoted/others*** who want to attend the ceremony MUST be accompanied by a parent. We have no way of contacting students who do not attend RHMS, so if you have a friend who was planning to attend, please be sure they have this information.

This is an important day for our 8th grade families and we will enforce the aforementioned guidelines to ensure it’s a safe and special event for all. We thank you in advance for your cooperation

NURSES NEWS

Are you familiar with health services related to school? California has mandates for services not only prior to school entry but also while your child attends school. Mandates include vaccines for school entry at Transitional or Regular Kindergarten and 7th grade. Screenings, such as hearing and vision, or scoliosis from board policy are also required.



Healthy Schools



DID YOU KNOW? For MEDICATIONS: Each office has a health clerk to assist with medications. ***ALL medications require a district permission form that is signed by a parent and a physician's order.*** This includes prescriptions (like a carried inhaler) OR anything Over-The-Counter (OTC) with a labeled "active ingredient", e.g. vitamins, herbal or cough drops, homeopathies, ibuprofen, essential oils, etc. The district nurse may write a health plan for your child as well. Exceptions, as written into education code, include hand sanitizers and sunscreen. Lotions or body oils that don't have a labeled "active ingredient" should be permitted – when in doubt, contact your health office!! AND, if your child is ILL (fever over 100) keep them home until fever free for

24 hours without the use of medication. For other medication concerns - ***do you need a medication form?***

WHAT ELSE TO KNOW? About the health office -- We provide first aid and see many students daily. We typically try to call home for concerns to be monitored, head bumps, etc. We work closely with the health department to maintain their recommended protocols for communicable disease.
