<u>Health plans</u>: If your child has a health plan, it should be rolled over to the next school year. Please reach out to the health office if you wish to edit or review your child's plan. If this is a medication dependent health plan, e.g. epinephrine, albuterol, etc. PLEASE be sure to reach out to your physician to obtain a medication order for the next school year. *This is required every year* by *CA Education Code that we must obtain a new medication form.* Alternatively, if you have something from your medical provider that provides the name of medication, route, timing (PRN or time of day), frequency and diagnosis we can attach this to our medication form with your signature.

If you received an email or letter about missing immunizations, you will want to review these materials carefully and reach out to either the El Dorado County Public Health Department (EDCPHD) or your family physician. Some pharmacies and facilities offer walk-in appointments for vaccinations. Please note you may receive a notification IF your child has immunizations in PROGRESS. Review page two of the IMM-231 for spacing. If OVERDUE, your child will be excluded.

Counselor's Corner

Welcome back to the 2023-24 school year. My name is Leslee Spencer-Long and I'm the counselor at Oak Meadow. I'll be going around the classrooms this month to introduce myself and all that the counseling department has to offer. Here are a few items I'll be highlighting:

Small group counseling-

Students may self-refer, be referred by parents, or teachers. Group topics include: friendship skills, self-regulation, anger management, stress management, self-esteem, separation/divorce, grief/loss. Monthly Classroom Guidance Lessons-

The Buckeye Union School District has adopted a research-based curriculum called THE
ZONES of REGULATION by Leah Kuypers. The Zones represent different feelings by categorizing them into different colors. Throughout the year, I'll be breaking down each zone to help students learn how to identify which emotions they're experiencing, while discovering tools to help regulate themselves (see attached for reference).

To help support student regulation, each grade level will also have a "Reset Kit" with many of the tools we'll be learning about this year, to be utilized if needed.

Team Raptor Peer Mediators-

In September, applications will be given to all 3rd-5th grade students who're interested in becoming peer mediators. Peer mediators help yard duty supervisors make sure playground rules are being followed, students are getting along, and connecting with each other.

Kindness Crew-

Each Wednesday I invite 3rd-5th graders to come have lunch, talk about Kindness, and brainstorm ways to help promote kindness throughout the school year.

Positive Action Tickets-

These tickets are earned when students are caught following our school rules by being respectful, responsible, and safe. Tickets are given by all school staff and peer mediators. Each week, tickets are drawn, student names are announced and rewards given.

Care Solace- Our district uses this service to help connect families to outside therapists. They streamline the process in finding a good fit for your counseling needs. If you're interested in 1:1 counseling support, let me know and I'd be happy to get the process started.
